STATEMENT 1: ORGANISATION AND FUNCTIONS

Victoria Police provides policing services to the Victorian community 24 hours a day, seven days a week, working to keep Victorians safe.

Police officers and Protective Services Officers (PSOs) are supported in their roles by public service professionals who work as administrators, managers and specialists in a range of functions such as administrative support, legal services, accounting, psychology and forensic sciences.

Effective frontline response service delivery is provided through 54 Police Service Areas (PSAs), split across 21 divisions within four regions - North West Metro, Southern Metro, Eastern and Western. These regional boundaries correspond with those of other Victorian government departments, enhancing cross-department service delivery, particularly in the area of emergency management.

Victoria Police is head by Chief Commissioner Shane Patterson APM and is part of the broad Department of Justice and Community Safety (DJCS) portfolio.

The Chief Commissioner of Police (CCP) reports directly to the Minister for Police, the Hon. Anthony Carbines MP, and also works closely with the Minister for the Prevention of Family Violence (the Hon. Ros Spence MP) and the Minister for Roads and Road Safety (the Hon. Ben Carroll MP).

STATEMENT 3: FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ARRANGEMENTS

The <u>Freedom of Information Act 1982</u> gives members of the community a legally enforceable right to information held by the government. Victoria Police supports this right by:

- making information about Victoria Police operations available to the public
- · making all rules and information about practices readily available to those affected by them
- facilitating a general right of access to documents held by Victoria Police (this access is limited only by the proper application of exceptions and exemptions provided for under the <u>Freedom of Information Act 1982</u>)
- delivering an efficient, timely and reasonably-costed process for disclosing information.

HOW TO MAKE A REQUEST

MAIL

You may make a request by sending a letter or application form requesting access to documents. Your letter should set out clearly the document(s) you require from Victoria Police, as well as providing sufficient detail to enable the document(s) you are seeking to be identified. Please visit the Victoria Police Freedom of Information website to download a copy of the application form.

You must also send a money order or cheque for the statutory application fee. Please visit our website for the current fee. If payment of the application fee would cause hardship, then please provide evidence that you qualify to have this fee waived (e.g. a Centrelink Healthcare card).

You will also need to provide proof of identification (e.g. driver's licence). If you are a solicitor submitting a request on your client's behalf, you will need to provide a signed authority from your client.

VICTORIA POLICE MANUAL

The Victoria Police Manual (VPM) and other corporate policy and procedure documents are issued under my authority in s.60, <u>Victoria Police Act 2013</u> and provide the rules, procedures and guidance to help us meet those obligations.

The VPM sets the behavioural, operational, and administrative standards for the organisation. It applies to Victoria Police employees of all ranks and employment types. The VPM is an electronic document and is available on disc for purchase by the public. You can purchase a single copy or an annual subscription by submitting the order form available from the Downloads section to the right. Alternatively, you can access the VPM for free from the Serial Section of the Victorian State Library.
